

LNRP Goatstown Road Project

Irish Water, in partnership with Dún Laoghaire–Rathdown County Council is upgrading the wastewater network along Goatstown Road.



1. Introduction

Irish Water working in partnership with Dún Laoghaire–Rathdown County Council is undertaking essential works to upgrade the wastewater network along Goatstown Road.

These works will involve construction of new gravity sewer to reduce capacity issues in the area and improve operational performance.

GMC Utilities Limited is working on behalf of Irish Water to deliver these works.

2. What is involved as part of this project?

This project involves:

- The construction of approximately 0.2km of new gravity sewer from Larchfield Avenue to Our Ladys Grove Primary School.

3. Programme of works

The works commenced on **Thursday 25 March 2021** and are expected to be completed **30th April 2021**. In order to minimise disruption a phased approach with areas of works limited to short sections will be adopted for the delivery of these works.

The standard working hours are generally between 8am and 6pm, with no work anticipated on Sundays and public holidays.

Traffic management will be in place during the course of the works in form of a stop/go traffic light system. Local and emergency traffic will be maintained at all times.

We understand that this type of works can be inconvenient and work crews will make every effort to minimise any disruption these necessary works cause.

4. What are the benefits?

The works carried out as part of this project will:

- Reduce capacity issues in the area and improve operational performance.
- Facilitate future growth in the area.
- Bring benefits in terms of health, integrity of the environment and improved service for all.
